The current university enrollment is approximately 2,000. The faculty includes many distinguished scholars and eminent researchers with doctoral degrees who are committed to excellence in teaching.

The university has teacher exchange programs with the University of Moscow in Russia, Beijing Language and Culture University in China, and the University of Alcala in Spain.





In order to help students gain cross-cultural experience and valuable practical knowledge for their future careers, the university offers accredited student exchange programs through arrangements with Eastern Washington University in the U.S. and Medicine Hat College in Canada, as well as 20 other partner universities in Australia, Austria, Canada, China, Russia, Spain, the U.K., and the U.S.A..
