English Proficiency Requirement

In the Japanese language program (JLP) at KCUFS, Japanese is used as the primary classroom language; in addition, English is used in the following situations:

- > Some guest lecturers may use English during the entire lecture.
- In the Japanese language classes, English may be used to explain grammatical concepts, vocabulary, etc. depending on the instructor if necessary.
- When it is difficult to communicate in Japanese, English is used for communication between JLP students and university staff.

To deal with the situations described above, applicants are strongly recommended to have an English proficiency of CEFR B1, IELTS 4.5, TOEFL 60 or equivalent.
