


1. Kobe City University of Foreign Studies (KCUFS)



Founded in 1946, KCUFS offers undergraduate and graduate-degree programs in English, Russian, Chinese and Spanish studies, as well as International Relations. The undergraduate programs offer a choice of the following courses: Linguistics and Literature, General Culture, Social Sciences, and International Communication. Our graduate schools offer masters and doctoral degree programs in linguistic, cultural and socials studies as well as double degree program with renowned overseas universities.

2. Japanese Language Program(JLP)

Exchange students coming to KCUFS from overseas partner universities are enrolled into our Japanese Language Program (JLP). This program aims to improve their Japanese language skills as well as deepening their understanding of Japanese culture. The study period is available for one semester or two semesters (1 academic year), starting either in Fall 2021or Spring 2022.

Curriculum

The program consists of Japanese language classes (Speaking, Listening, Reading, Writing, Grammar and Business Japanese), Kanji (Chinese characters) class, Japanese Affairs and fieldtrips to sites of cultural and historical importance. All classes are mainly offered in Japanese language. Instructors are committed to creating a positive and supportive learning environment in which students can realize their full potential.

The program offers 4 levels; Upper Elementary level, Lower Intermediate level, Upper Intermediate level, and Advanced level. All students are required to take a placement test after arrival and are divided into groups based on their Japanese proficiency.
