What is CCC?

CCC stands for Citizens Chat Cafe, which is a monthly event held at Kobe City University of Foreign Studies (KCUFS). It provides a platform for local residents to communicate with Japanese and international students in English. The event is inspired by City Chat Cafe, a similar initiative that used to take place in Tsukuba City. This popular event was organized by the University of Tsukuba, the Tsukuba International Association, and the Tsukuba Science City Network.

Why CCC was established?

The Citizens Chat Café (CCC) was established to address the need for a platform where local residents can communicate in English and engage in meaningful conversations with university students. Recognizing the importance of fostering communication between the local community and students, CCC was created as an initiative to bridge this gap.

One of the primary aims of CCC is to give back to the community, aligning with the mission of KCUFS as a city university. By offering this monthly event, KCUFS, with the support of its staff and students, provides a free platform on campus where local residents can meet and talk with both Japanese and international students in English. The event covers a wide range of topics, helping to foster cross-cultural exchange and language practice in an informal, supportive environment. Through this initiative, CCC seeks to contribute to the community by promoting international communication and understanding.

Brief Event Description

The Kobe Citizens Chat Cafe was launched in 2024 as part of the Kobe City University of Foreign Studies' promotion project. This is an event which primarily brings together international students from the university and local citizens of Kobe, offering them the opportunity to enjoy conversations in English. Held once a month, participants engage in discussions on various topics for approximately two hours, interacting with people of different backgrounds, age groups, and English proficiency levels.



Purpose

The purpose of the event is to strengthen the connection between the university, our Japanese and international students, and the local community, while fostering mutual cultural understanding. Additionally, it aims to provide local residents with an opportunity to engage in conversations with international students in English, offering them a chance to enhance their English skills and fostering meaningful cultural exchange.

Date

The sessions were held once a month, on Saturdays. Dates are as follows. 2024 9/28, 10/26, 11/16, 12/7, 2025 1/25.

Location

September's session was held at the Miki Hall at KCUFS. Other sessions were held at the meeting room 4&5 in Gakusei Kaikan building at KCUFS.

Time

All sessions were held at the same time, from 13:30 to 15:30.

Topics


September	Sustainable Development Goals

January	How to spend winter vacation & New year's resolutions




Who attended?

October: 31 participants




November: 26 participants






December: 43 participants
